New class for Spring 2009, Understanding Terrorism

With world terrorism movements growing and ominous public unrest and violence in the streets of some countries, it has become more important than ever to understand the motives and beliefs of terrorist groups operating in today's world. This class will clarify the methods they use and how the world should respond to them.

This course will provide an indispensable overview of one of the twenty-first century's most urgent issues. The material will cover many of the questions society has regarding the motives and operation moods of terror groups within the United States and throughout the world. Among the topics that will be discussed in this class are the following topics: The

Concept of Terrorism, Tactics of Terrorism, State Sponsored Terrorism, Terrorism and Religion, Terrorism and the Media, Terrorism and the Internet, Women and Terrorism, Countering Terrorism, Trends and Projections. This class will be taught by instructor Gabriel Kovnator, a recognized subject matter expert on street and prison gangs and terrorism.

The instructor for this course, Mr. Gabriel Kovnator, was born in Haifa, Israel in 1951. He was inducted into the Israeli Army in 1969 where he served as a demolition expert. Soon after, he was promoted to the post of Sergeant, which he held while serving his country during the Yom Kippur War of 1973. After the war, he chose to come to the

USA, where he completed his education at California State University, Los Angeles.

Instructor Kovnator was recognized by U.S Department of Justice, Federal Bureau of Investigation and Sheriff Sherman Block for his involvement in investigations that involved sensitive issues, international in scope. From 1997 to the present, Mr. Kovnator has also been an Instructor at Los Angeles Mission College. The classes he has taught include:

Understanding Terrorism, Understanding Street and Prison Gangs, Introduction to Criminal Justice, Introduction to Corrections, and Principles and Procedures of the Justice System.
