New changes in the AJ Degree requirements



Effective immediately, the requirements for the A.S. degree in Administration of Justice have changed. The major requires the same amount of units however, two classes are being replaced. AJ67 is being replaced with AJ160 (Police Management) and AJ6 is being replaced with AJ75 (Intro to Corrections).

The reasons for the changes are many. However, one of the main reasons is to assist students in transferring to the

criminal justice program at Cal State L.A. and like programs.

For instance; five of the eight classes for the new degree requirements articulate directly to Cal State L.A.'s department of Criminal Justice and Criminalistics. This means that students will be working on their transfer classes to Cal State at the same time finishing the requirements for the A.S. degree here at Mission. This is a significant savings of time and tuition money for students. To further assist students, we will be offering these required courses every semester and during summer at various times and days. We will also begin alternating the times we offer courses every semester as

well as offering multiple sections of the same course.

Again, this is to assist students in completing our program as fast as possible. AJ 6 (Patrol Procedures) will still be offered as an elective in the program every semester.

New Basic Police Academy Skills Certificate for students

Effective immediately, the AJ program will now be offering a skills certificate in preparing students who want to go into a career in policing.

The skills certificate program consists of 5 courses that help prepare students entering the police academy. These courses will be offered every semester and many are even applicable to the A.S. degree in AJ. Many times applicants are asked in police interviews what have they

done to prepare themselves for entering a career in policing. This skills certificate demonstrates to police hiring boards that the applicant has seriously prepared themselves by taking a course of study in policing; both academically and physically. Along with AJ courses, there is a physical education component a "body conditioning" class. One of the biggest problems police cadets often face is preparing themselves

physically to meet the challenges of the police academy. By completing this program of study, students not only prepare themselves for the academy but also are able to demonstrate to a hiring board they are ready for the challenge.
