## School Police Department hiring for Safety Officers



The Los Angeles School Police Department is now hiring for the position of School Safety Officer. School Safety Officers guard District schools, buildings, grounds and other district property. School Safety Officers also patrol school grounds and investigate unusual

conditions. There are currently several positions available throughout the Los Angeles school district area with both fulltime and parttime positions. Approximate salary is \$26,100 to \$32,400. Paid vacation leave, medical and dental insurance coverage and retirement.

Minimum requirements for appointments are a high school diploma and preferably experience working as a security guard and/or courses taken in criminal justice at the college level.

Applicants also need a valid driver's license at the

time of appointment.

The selection process involves a written test, interview, medical examination and thorough background investigation.

tuition costs. Students will also have the ability to finish all of the lower division requirements for Cal State L.A.'s criminal justice B.S. degree while still here at Mission working on their A.S. degree.

## U.S. Border Patrol is hiring-Protect America

The U.S. Border Patrol is hiring for the position of Border Patrol Agent.

The priority mission of the Border Patrol is to prevent terrorists and their weapons, from entering the country. Agents are also given the task of preventing illegal drugs from entering the U.S.

Border Patrol agents begin their careers on the southwest border near California, Arizona, New Mexico, West

Texas and South Texas. From there, agents have the option of transferring/ promoting to the northern and coastal borders, to include Puerto Rico.

Starting salary is anywhere from \$35,595 per year to \$45,189 per year depending on education and experience.

Minimum requirements include being under the age of 40 at application, valid drivers

license, medical and drug screening, physical fitness test and background check.

Benefits include health, medical, dental and vision insurance, 401K, vacation and sick leave.
