Improved class scheduling

In the past, our program had offered AJ classes on a very restrictive basis. Classes were offered only once a week and only one section per course. Courses were also offered only at 3:40pm and 7:00pm. Occasionally an AJ course would be offered on Saturday mornings.

Over the past several months, we have spoken with numerous students in our program who expressed frustration over class availability.

We are happy to report that our practice of scheduling courses will change drastically beginning in the Spring of 2008. Part of our mission is to make it convenient for students to take the classes needed to earn a degree, certificate and classes that transfer and articulate to CSUN and Cal State L.A. We will accomplish this by offering all of the required courses for the AJ degree every semester and offering

several sections of the most popular courses at various days and times. This will give students the ability to pick and chose the best time and day to attend class. Some courses will be offered in the mornings and on Fridays and Saturdays. This new practice will also alleviate class overcrowding and classes competing with each other.
