## Sheriff's department hiring student workers

The Los Angeles County Sheriff's department is currently accepting applications for Student Worker. Qualifications include being at least 16 years of age and currently enrolled in college.

Starting salary is \$9.63 per hour and appointees may be asked to work up to 20 hours per week and up to 40 hours per week when not attending

school. Successful applicants will be asked to fill a number of vacancies throughout the department including patrol stations in La Cresenta and Santa Clarita, both of which are within driving distance of the college.
