Getting Started

Even though you do not meet with your instructor until the second weekend after the semester begins, the online component begins February 9, 2009. Follow the checklist below to get started in your class now.

1. Choose a Campus

Select the campus to attend your weekend class and make note of its time and location.

2. Buy Your Books

The back of this page lists the required and recommend books for your course. Buy your books as soon as possible so that you can get started on your assigned readings. Textbooks can be purchased at City, Southwest, Mission, Valley, and Pierce Colleges or from most online bookstores.

3. Log In

The class website opens **February 9**, log in and read your course syllabus. It will list all assignments and quizzes times and due dates. You can find log in instructions on the last page of this letter.

4. Email Your Instructor

Once you have logged in, email your instructor and let him know that you have successfully logged in to the class website.

5. Plan Your Schedule

Weekend College courses are fast paced—covering a lot of material in a short period of time. At a minimum, you can expect to spend 10 to 12 hours per week completing the assignments. Schedule time in advance for reading the textbooks, watching the video episodes, and completing the online assignments. If you plan to watch or record the videos on the educational cable channel LA 36, also note those times and set the timer on your Tivo or DVD recorder in advance. 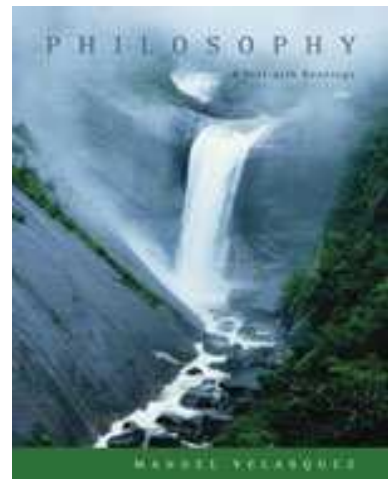

While my reasons for teaching philosophy are various, of direct and immediate relevance is the following: I enjoy engaging inquiring minds in the exploration of philosophical topics of profound importance and the deep and enduring questions they engender.

The Philosophy 1 class in which you have enrolled is a hybrid course consisting of video presentations, textual materials, on-line instruction and live interaction in order to simultaneously encourage an appreciation of the nature and development of western thought, and the development of critical thinking skills and computer literacy. To assist you in orienting yourselves and getting the most out of the course from the outset, the college, ITV and I have provided a number of features on the ITV and *Etudes* websites:

On the enclosed material and the ITV website, you will find the video cablecast schedule for this quarter.


Under “syllabus” and under “resources” on the *Etudes* site, you will find the syllabus for this course, which includes my office hours and the grading system for the course.

Under “resources” on the *Etudes* site, you will find some of the better philosophy websites on the Internet, some useful *non*-philosophy websites, several academic support sites, supplementary reading materials, downloadable outline sheets to enable you to take better notes in class, research paper guidelines and suggestions, and a complete timetable for the reading assignments so that you can do as well as possible on the tests and quizzes, and take fullest advantage of the in-class lectures. Exploring “resources” and familiarizing yourselves with its contents will be well worth the time; indeed, I cannot stress enough how much useful and important information appears there.

The assigned text for the course is Manuel Velasquez’s, *Philosophy, Tenth Edition* (2008), and Velasquez’s and White’s *Telecourse Study Guide — The Examined Life* is highly recommended.

The materials provided throughout *Etudes*, and included in the video episodes, the lectures and the texts should be useful, but it may be the case that special difficulties may arise with which you may need assistance. Online Class Website

Step 1. Where do I go to log on to this course?

- Go to <http://etudes-ng.fhda.edu/portal>
- Bookmark this page!
- Enter your user ID

Step 2. What is my User ID?

In lowercase letters and with no spaces:

- use the first 2 letters of your first name
- *and* the first 2 letters of your last name
- *and* the last 5-digits of your student ID #

Example: Donna Smith:

Step 3. What is my Password?

Using four numbers together with no spaces:

- use two numbers for your birth month
- *and* use two numbers for the birth day

Example: if your birth date was January 3
