



VII. CTE Licensure Pass Rates

Standard: 90%Target: 100%

The ACCJC definition for **licensure pass rate** is, in programs for which students must pass a licensure examination in order to work in their field of study, "the number of students who passed the licensure examination divided by the number of students who took the examination." The ACCJC Annual Report form also specifies that rates should only be reported for programs where there were at least ten students who completed the program in the designated year.

Currently, the only program that requires a licensure pass rate is the Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) program, which was launched in Spring 2016. The CNA licensure pass rate was 100% in every term from Spring 2016 through Summer 2018 except Fall 2017 when it was 93%. The one student who did not pass in Fall 2017 is scheduled for a second opportunity to retake the exam.

VIII. CTE Job Placement Rates

• Standard: Meet the State-set performance goal

The ACCJC definition for **job placement rate** is, for students completing certificate programs and career education degrees, "the number of students employed in the year following graduation divided by the number of students who completed the program." The College uses Perkins IV Core Indicator 4 (Employment) for our job placement rates, and has set the standard at the Stateset performance goal. Programs with 10 or more completers in a given academic year must meet this Standard.

- **Cohort**: Enrolled in at least one credit vocational course during the academic year (not through dual enrollment) and reported a social security number.
- **Timeframe**: The cohort year begins in the summer through the end of spring. The outcomes year is the year following the cohort year. The program year is the year following the outcomes year (the academic year that the data becomes available to the public).

The State-set performance goal for the 2015-16 cohort was 67.5 percent.
